The MARC Grant provides a cash award up to \$500.00, and a certificate of recognition presented at the AARC Annual Conference.

TO APPLY

Please submit the following materials:

1. Vita and cover letter.
2. Faculty letter of support.
3. A five page research proposal* written in APA 7th ed. style that includes the following:

- A title page, abstract, introduction, methodology, and selected references.
- 50-word statement indicating how the project will be helped by the grant.
- 50-word statement discussing the project's significance.
- A projected budget and timetable for the project's completion.

*The title page and references are not included in the page count. Proposals can be formatted in double or single space.

All documents should be amalgamated into one .pdf file and submitted to the AARC Grants Committee Co-Chairs via email AARCstudentgrants@gmail.com. Please include the specific award you applying for in the title of the application & a statement confirming current AARC membership.

Eligibility: Graduate students must be active members of AARC. Individuals are only eligible to receive one AARC grant funded award per year across all AARC grant funded opportunities and an individual may only appear on **one** of the following proposals including a Sponsored Scholarship Proposal as PI or Co-PI, Donald Hood Student Research Grant, or MARC student research grant.

Requirements for Awardees:

- Complete paperwork to process allocations of funds, including submitting an IRB approval letter for the research project within three months of the award announcement.
- Complete project within 12 months of receiving funding.
- Submit completed project as a research poster proposal or presentation for the AARC Annual Conference.
